Retirement—Ms. Margaret Shields

Following over 20 years of teaching service in Eureka, Ms. Margaret Shields retired at the end of the 2009-2010 school year. A native of Co.Galway, Ms. Shields is widely

remembered as a dedicated teacher of English and Geography. In the teaching of English, Ms. Shields frequently supported her class work by organising trips to the theatre and cinema. Several Shakespearean plays and a variety of English novels were dramatised for pupils, committing them hopefully, to long term memory!

Ms. Shields' geography lessons were often supplemented by field trips, some local, some further afield.


In recent years, Ms. Shields took on the role of Healthy Eating Co-ordinator and the department co-ordinator of SPHE (Social, & Personal Health Education). During this time, she set up a Healthy Eating Committee, comprised of pupil members from all years. These pupils worked very closely with Ms. Shields and were loyal and devoted in their projects. The committee engaged in a tireless campaign to spread awareness among pupils of the importance of healthy dietary choices. The campaign led to the introduction of fruit, smoothies, yoghurts, soups and other healthy but tasty treats to the school canteen menu! Under Ms. Shields, certain less than healthy items were subsequently removed from the menu, hopefully leading to a healthier school population!

In her role as SPHE co-ordinator, Ms. Shields regularly organised, for each year group, visiting speakers to the school, on topics such as mental health awareness, depression, teenage sexuality and general public safety / protection.

We thank Ms. Shields for her dedicated teaching and invaluable contribution to school life. We wish her a long, healthy and happy retirement!



Staff and past pupils of Eureka learned with sadness of the death, at the age of 96, of Sr. Benignus Kelly. A native of Ballinabrackey, Co. Meath, Sr. Benignus entered the convent in Kells in 1934. Her life's work was in education. Her teaching career began in the 1940s when she joined the staff of Kells secondary school for girls, which in 1956 became Eureka Secondary School.



Sr. Benignus was principal of the school from 1966 to 1980, and at a time when resources were scarce, she made sure that help was given to pupils, when needed, for books and uniforms. Under her leadership, the school developed and expanded and she introduced subjects like chemistry, physics, German and higher level maths, when they were not generally available in girls' schools at the time.

Although she taught Irish & geography, her life long passion was the teaching of maths, which she continued long after she officially retired. For several years, following her retirement, she gave extra maths tuition to pupils who were repeating the Leaving Cert, at both higher and ordinary level.

She liked to keep in touch with her past pupils, and loved to hear that they were successful and happy. Many remained in contact with her.

Eureka students and staff provided a guard of honour, both at her removal to St. Colmcille's Church and for the funeral. This guard of honour stretched from the doors of the church, down the route of the funeral cortege past Eureka school. The large numbers of people who attended her wake and funeral, were a testament to the loyalty, affection & respect she inspired in all who knew her.
