### TY Legal Studies - PAL Competition

PAL stands for Public Access to Law, a programme which gives T.Y. students an insight into law, as seen through the eyes of a practising barrister or solicitor.

This year Eureka entered the PAL Mock Trial Competition for the first time. On Saturday 9<sup>th</sup> April 2011 the team travelled to the first round of the competition which was held in the Courts of Criminal Justice in Dublin. The team:

The team won all three of their mock trials on that day. The organiser of the competition, Mr. Vincent Martin praised the extremely high standard of performance of the top teams before announcing that Eureka got the highest points in the country! The teams with the four highest points went through to the next stage- the Semi-Finals of the competition.

Eureka's team travelled back to the Courts of Criminal Justice on 7<sup>th</sup> May 2011. Eureka was drawn to compete in their Semi-Final against Our Ladies College, Greenhills, Drogheda. Our Ladies College has an honourable record in the competition. In 2009 it was the winner of the National Mock Trial competition and that team went on to win the International competition in New York! Despite the stiff competition, the Eureka team put up a stunning performance to win their way to the Final. Here they met with Alexandra College, Milltown, Dublin. Mr. Justice Peter Kelly, Judge Mary Collins and Judge Terence O'Sullivan sat on the bench to determine who would be the winners of the 2011 National Mock Trial.

All of the witnesses gave Oscar winning performances and the barristers were simply superb. To a hushed Court, Mr. Justice Peter Kelly announced that Eureka had arrived into the competition 'like a comet!' and declared Eureka the champions of 2011. To crown it all, Aoife Cosgrove and Ruth O'Reilly were awarded the Harry Hill Cup as the joint winners of the top prize for 'Best Performance'. Katie Meegan was presented with a silver medal for her magnificent performance doing a live broadcast for the 'T.V Presenter' Competition. Congrats to the team and a huge thanks to the team's coach and Legal Studies teacher Ms. Dolan for her time, energy, expertise and commitment in preparing the girls for battle during the past few months! Thanks also to Martin & Pauline Cosgrove for their considerable help and advice to the team at all stages of the competition.

### TY Musical - "Little Miss T"

This year's musical, "Little Miss T" was performed in the school gym from Tuesday 3rd to Friday 6th May. Produced by Mrs. Yore, Musical Direction - Ms. Lyne, Art, Set / Stage Design by Ms. Weir, assisted by her TY art team, 80 Transition Year pupils staged this hilarious comedy. Loosely based on the old children's fairytale "Thumbellina", "Little Miss T" offered a 21st century take on the original tale, aided in no small part by Mrs. Yore's re-writing of large tracts of the script, providing the audience with a sharp, witty, contemporary humour, evidenced by the appearance of none other than "Jedward" (played by Emile Sheridan and Aine Bennett) and X-Factor judges Cheryl Cole (Charlotte Farrelly), Dannii Minogue (Jackie Kavanagh), Louis Walsh (Sarah Tobin) and Simon Cowell (Sophie Tevlin).

The story centres around Thumbellina (Andrea Geraghty), a tiny girl, no bigger than the size of a thumb, who be-

moans her limited life and yearns for the love of a boy. Along comes the equally miniature Fairy Prince (Hannah Maher) with his two sidekicks, John and Edward (Emile Sheridan & Aine Bennett)! Thumbellina and the Prince, following an initially hostile meeting, very soon fall in love and Thumbellina is soon thinking marriage!! However, the path of true love is certainly not smooth, thanks to a family of show business toads who happen to hear Thumbellina's beautiful singing and decide to kidnap her to join their singing group. Tommy Toad (Ruth O'Reilly) instantly wants to marry her, declaring "I luurrrve herrrr!". His mother Mrs. Toad (Judith Burke) agrees, as it would keep all the profits within the family! The toads must compete with other scheming suitors along the way, including the sly Beetle (Katie Meegan) and the menacing rapper Mr. Mole (Sadhbh O'Toole). Thumbellina's great friend, a bird named Jacquimo (Aoife Cosgrove) provides a shoulder on which to cry and

offers to become Thumbellina's Royal Wedding planner! During this time, the Prince is frantic with worry, using all his royal powers to find the missing Thumbellina, who meanwhile has become "engaged" to Mr. Mole, thanks to the meddling of matchmaker Mrs. Mouse (Chloe Smith), bearing more than a slight resemblance to Mrs. Doyle, of Father Ted fame! Thumbellina hears that the Prince has been found dead and resigns herself to a loveless, lonely life. However, ultimately, true love reigns as the Prince is found alive and well, is reunited with Thumbellina, their love story culminating in the Royal Wedding (pictured above!)

Accompanied by a live rock band, songs included Bon Jovi's "Livin' on a Prayer", Katy Perry's "Firework", Adele's "Make You Feel My Love". The able cast were supported musically by a backing choir of 24 singers from 5th yr and L.Cert. Innovative, clever, lively dances were choreographed especially for the show by Transition Year pupils: Katie Duffy, Sheree Coldrick, Kasey Sheridan, Aisling Govern, Katie Carry, Eimear Duffy & Andrea Geraghty.

Ms. Weir and her TY art group used vivid colours, to create yet again wonderful sets depicting the "Vale of the Fairies"! Normal sized objects were depicted as giant to the occupants of the fairy world! A highlight of this year's set was a "giant" fairytale open book, used in the opening scene during the narrator's "Once upon a Time" and a 'giant' Coca Cola can.








#### Loveshack


